Parameters to Apply for the Grant

APPLICABLE FOR INDIVIDUALS/COMMUNITY REPRESENTATIVES/ COMMUNITY-RUN ORGANISATIONS

- The project should be based in Indian Eastern Himalayan region.
- Preference will be given to project proposals from Mizoram, Manipur, Nagaland, Tripura, Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh states of the Indian Eastern Himalayan belt.
- Project must be aligned to the theme of 'Rewilding the Indian Eastern Himalayas'.
- The project should cover a minimum area of 25 Hectares and cover minimum of 25,000 saplings in the area.
- Project impacts must be measurable and appropriate indicators must be provided.

INTRODUCING: BALIPARA FOUNDATION AWARDS GRANT FOR 'REWILDING THE EASTERN HIMALAYAS'

- Projects designed to engage and enhance well being of forest-fringe indigenous communities, women, youth in the will be given preference.
- Approximately 80% of the total grant should cover programme operations. The budget layout should clarify the operations verticals (Travel, miscellaneous expenses needs to be justified in the proposal) and assets (infrastructural building) specifically. Funding must be used predominantly towards field-based activities.
- Preference will be given to projects which already has a community conservation framework/restored habitats site and has already been a part of the rewilding journey.
- Applications will only be accepted through the online grants portal on The Balipara Foundation website.
- Successful applicants must submit quarterly reports and a final report on the work by the Balipara Foundation.
- The applications will be reviewed through a structured process that would assess in detail the impacts of the program, deliverables and sustainability of the proposed work.

Mentorship: The Balipara Foundation is pleased to announce a dedicated mentorship module for the Rewilding project dedicated under it's social grants, to enhance scientific intervention for the selected individual/ community organization, support technology utilization & facilitation and strengthening implementation strategies of the project in the proposed site with knowledge and technical support from the Balipara Foundation consultation team. The Mentorship module will include-

- a) Nurturing the recipient of the grant to enhance skill training and development in the rewilding journey.
- a) Assisting and guiding in documentation and formulation of the programme.
- a) Orchestrating in-depth discussions/ panel with policy makers/businesses/ government/local NGOs – bringing forward the community model to the global audience.
