Student Death Assam Rising Guwahati, April 28

A Class 8 student, Kunal Barman, tragically died after falling into a ditch in Pathsala, Assam, on April 27. Kunal, a student at Christ Jyoti School, had ventured into a remote field with four friends early in the morning. After spending some time there, Kunal fell into the ditch, and his friends fled the scene. Upon receiving information, the police and State Disaster Response Force launched a rescue operation and recovered Kunal's body. Authorities are investigating the circumstances behind the boys' presence in the secluded area, as their actions remain suspicious. The community mourns the loss of the young life under tragic and mysterious circumstances.

Power Conference Shillong, April 28

Meghalaya's Power Minister, AT Mondal, raised concerns at the Regional Power Ministers' Conference in Gangtok, urging better terms for the state regarding Pump Storage Projects (PSPs). Mondal argued that current proposals were unfavorable, and Meghalaya should receive benefits akin to those from conventional hydel power. The Union Power Minister promised to revisit the modalities to ensure a fair deal for the state. Mondal also requested central government support for small hydropower projects and the extension of schemes like NERPSIP to boost transmission capacity. He highlighted Meghalaya's significant hydropower stential and improvements in the state's power sector over the past five years, noting a reduction in AT&C losses.

Ceasefire Announcement Moscow, April 28 :

Russian President Vladimir Putin has declared a three-day ceasefire in Ukraine from May 8th to 10th, coinciding with Russia's Victory Day on May 9th. The Kremlin expects Ukraine to adhere to the ceasefire, warning that violations would prompt a "strong and effective" response from Russian forces. This announcement follows criticism of Russia's continued bombardment of Ukrainian civilian areas. Additionally, Russia's ally, North Korea, confirmed its troops' involvement in the war against Ukraine for the first time. Meanwhile, U.S. President Trump expressed disappointment over Russia's actions and suggested Ukrainian President Zelensky may be open to negotiations over Crimea in exchange for peace.

Fatal Collision Assam Rising

Guwahati, April 28

A fatal road accident occurred near the Lokhra flyover, Guwahati, on the night of April 27. A moving truck collided with a stationary truck parked for wheel repairs. The handyman working on the repairs was trapped and killed instantly by the collision's force. The driver of the moving truck suffered severe injuries and was trapped in his vehicle for some time before being rescued. Authorities are working to confirm the identities of the deceased handyman and the injured driver. The incident has raised concerns about road safety and the dangers of stationary vehicles on highways.



Main kingpin of the attack on MP **Bordoloi identified**

Assam Rising, Nagaon, April 28: Akhilesh Kumar Singh, IGP, Assam Police today rushed to the spot in Dhing assembly constituency where Congress MP Pradyut Bordoloi and Congress MLA Sibamoni Bora were attacked by a gang of unidentified miscreants, coming in black dresses with masks on face on Sunday last and took stock about the sudden barbaric attack so far. During his visit to the spot, IGP Akhilesh Kumar Singh said to the local media persons here that the police got all in detail and the attackers of the Congress MP Pradyut Bordoloi and Congress MLA Sibamoni Bora would be arrested soon. Meanwhile Superintendent of Police, Nagaon Swapnanil Deka said to media persons here that one of the attackers was identified and his name is Imdadul Islam, hailing from Bhuragaon in Morigaon district. The senior police official said that Imdadul Islam was a Congress worker and was expelled from the party a couple of days back. He said that the police operation was on in search of him and would be under police net soon. On the other hand, the Congress MP Pradyut Bordoloi along with MLA Sibamoni Bora addressed a press conference this afternoon at Nagaon Rajiv Bhavan in which both the Congress public representatives congratulated the Superintendent of police, Nagaon Swapnanil Deka for such development. Both the opposition party leaders regretted such incidents, saying that such activities would crush the dignity of the democracy in the state or country.

The Nuclear War Threats

The horrific terror attack in Pahalgam, which claimed the lives of several innocent civilians has once again plunged South Asia into a tense and volatile atmosphere. Even more disturbing than the attack itself has been Pakistan's reckless escalation in rhetoric, with veiled — and sometimes open — threats of nuclear retaliation against India. Such posturing is not only irresponsible but dangerous for the entire region and the world at large. First and foremost. nuclear weapons are not instruments of casual intimidation. They are weapons of mass destruction, meant solely as a deterrent under the gravest of existential threats. Threatening their use over a conventional terror incident, however tragic, marks a gross deviation from the norms of responsible state behavior. It sends a chilling message: that Pakistan's leadership is willing to contemplate global catastrophe for the sake of political posturing. It must be stated unequivocally: India, as the world's largest democracy and a responsible nuclear power, has always maintained a doctrine of "No First Use" (NFU) regarding nuclear weapons. Its commitment to restraint stands in stark contrast to Pakistan's increasingly aggressive tone. While India rightly reserves the right to respond firmly to acts of terror emanating from across the border, New Delhi has consistently sought to avoid escalation to a nuclear dimension. Pakistan's nuclear threats also betray a certain desperation. Faced with growing international isolation. internal political instability, and a floundering economy, Islamabad seems eager to distract from its own failures. By invoking the specter of nuclear war, it seeks to draw global attention and internationalize what it calls the "Kashmir issue." However, the world is no longer willing to ignore the clear pattern: terror attacks on Indian soil have repeatedly been traced back to groups operating with impunity from Pakistani territory. This reckless behavior must be called out, not rewarded. The global community — including the United Nations, major powers like the United States, China, and Russia — must make it clear to Pakistan that nuclear blackmail is unacceptable. Words have consequences, and nuclear threats are not a mere diplomatic tool; they invite miscalculation, panic, and potential catastrophe. It is equally important for India to stay measured but firm. New Delhi's response must be strategic: a combination of diplomatic pressure, enhanced security measures, and targeted counterterrorism efforts. At the same time, India must continue engaging with the global community to expose the true nature of Pakistan's terror ecosystem and the dangers of its irresponsible nuclear brinkmanship.South Asia, a region that houses nearly two billion people, cannot afford the luxury of missteps. Nuclear war is not a video game or a diplomatic bluff; it is an existential threat to humanity. Pakistan must be reminded that it bears a grave responsibility to act in accordance with international norms and to exercise restraint, even in the most trying of times. The memory of the innocent lives lost in Pahalgam demands justice, but it also demands wisdom. India must act with strength and clarity - and Pakistan must step back from the precipice before it is too late.

Public sentiment is boiling, demanding a strong response and a decisive message to the perpetrators. For a popular leader like Prime Minister Narendra Modi, public expectations weigh heavily. After Pulwama, India took time to deliberate and then launched a strike on Jaish-e-Mohammad camps in Balakot. This time too, New Delhi must weigh its options carefully before proceeding.After all, as PM Modi once put it, "This is not the era of war." Calculated, precise solutions must be sought.Communal harmony is most essential at the moment. Even before the Pahalgam attack, the Waqf Act and other polarising issues sparked riots in Murshidabad, Nagpur and other locations, raising significant concerns about internal unity. Therefore, it is all the more important for the Centre to ensure support from Opposition-ruled states like West Bengal and Tamil Nadu and present a united front.In times of national crisis, politics must take a backseat. Encouragingly, Indian political parties seem to be on the same page. Rahul Gandhi's phone call to home minister Amit Shah and other gestures of support from Opposition leaders mark a shift from the 2019 Pulwama aftermath. An all-party meeting was convened on 24 April, notably the same day Pakistan scheduled its National Security Meeting. With major powers

taken note. The key lies in how effectively India can galvanise global support. World leadersincluding American President Donald Trump, Russian President Vladimir Putin, Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, French President Emmanuel Macron, and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu have already expressed solidarity with India. President Xi Jinping, however, has remained silent, even as the Chinese ambassador to India issued condolences.China and Russia are key players in the

region whose support is essential. While New Delhi did not explicitly side with Moscow on the Russia-Ukraine war, its strategic neutrality was seen as a gesture of preserving long-standing ties. Therefore, President Vladimir Putin would likely support India, at least diplomatically. Beijing should also be engaged to prevent any adverse reaction, though expecting it to act firmly against Pakistan is unrealistic. China may support Pakistan quietly, as the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) has come under attack from Baloch insurgents, with Pakistan blaming India for destabilising Balochistan. However, international support from other major powers could neutralise China's intent to help Pakistan overtly. Michael Rubin, a former Pentagon official and senior fellow at the American Enterprise Institute, has drawn a parallel between Osama bin Laden and Pakistan's Army Chief, General Asim Munir. He has called

The Russia-Ukraine War and the Hamas-Israel conflict have shown that full-scale wars are prolonged, exhausting, and come at great cost.The growing Bangladesh-Pakistan-China axis must also be considered. Pakistan has been strengthening military ties with Bangladesh and has made inroads into its army

The attack was not just a massacre; it was an assault on hope, on the idea that Kashmir could move beyond its troubled past. Experts like Pravin Sawhney warn that suspending the Indus Waters Treaty risks escalation, while others, like Christopher Clary, see India's options-cross-border firing or airstrikes-carrying the threat of a wider conflict. Pakistan's counterclaims of a "false flag" operation, citing the logistical improbability of such a deep strike, only deepen the divide. For now, the meadows of Baisaran remain closed, a silent testament to lives lost and a future uncertain. The question isn't just how India will respond, but whether the cycle of violence can ever be broken, allowing Kashmir to reclaim its soul as a haven of peace.

The idvillic landscape, often dubbed "mini Switzerland" for its lush greenery and breathtaking vistas, turned into a place of horror as gunfire shattered the peace. By the time the attackers fled into the dense pine forests, 26 peoplemostly Hindu tourists, including two foreigners from the UAE and Nepal, and two locals-lay dead. More than 20 others were wounded, some critically. This was the deadliest militant attack in Indianadministered Kashmir since the 2008 Mumbai attacks, a moment that not only broke the hearts of families but also sent shockwaves through India, reigniting tensions with Pakistan and casting a dark shadow over the region's fragile sense of normalcy.We can still picture the scene through the accounts of survivors, their voices trembling as they recounted the chaos. Vinu Bai, a 65-year-old tourist from Gujarat, was sitting in a meadow chair when she heard three sharp shots. Panic erupted as people screamed and ran for cover, but the attackers were methodical. They didn't fire indiscriminately at first; they asked for names, demanded some recite Islamic verses, and, in a chilling detail,

who rushed to the meadow after a police call, described a sight he said he'd never forget—a place of beauty transformed into a graveyard. The attack was claimed initially by The Resistance Front (TRF), a shadowy offshoot of the Pakistan-based

The Jammu and Kashmir Police released sketches of three militants, linking them to Lashkar-e-Taiba and noting that at least two were foreigners with prior involvement in attacks in the Poonch region. Pakistan, predictably, denied any role, with its Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar demanding proof. The truth, as always in this contested region,

remains murky, caught between competing narratives and a history of mistrust.For the people of Kashmir, the attack was a gut punch. Tourism is the lifeblood of the valley, a beacon of hope after decades of militancy. In recent years, Pahalgam had seen a surge in visitors, drawn to its serene rivers and majestic mountains. The region was gearing up for the peak summer season, with the Amarnath Yatra pilgrimage set to begin in July. But the attack changed everything. Tour operators in Kolkata, a key hub for travel to Kashmir, reported mass cancellations. "This is madness," said Bilolaksha Das, chairman of the eastern chapter of the Travel Agents Federation of India. He feared the incident could undo years of recovery, a sentiment echoed by

Mirwaiz Umar Farooq, speaking at Srinagar's Jamia Masjid, declared that Kashmiris stood "shoulder to shoulder" with the victims, and a minute of silence was observed before prayers. "Not in my name," was the resounding message from the valley, a rejection of violence that sought to tarnish their culture of warmth. Yet, the attack also exposed the fault lines. In Muslimmajority Kashmir, the targeting of Hindu tourists stoked fears of sectarian division, while across India, it unleashed a wave of Islamophobic and anti-Kashmiri sentiment.In states like Uttarakhand, Punjab, and Uttar Pradesh, Kashmiri students and traders faced harassment, heckling, and even eviction. Shopkeepers refused to trade with them, and farright Hindu groups fueled the rhetoric. The BJP-led government in Haryana issued directives to protect Kashmiri students, but the damage was done. The attack had ripped open old wounds, reminding everyone that the narrative of "normalcy" in Kashmir, heavily promoted since the revocation of Article 370, was a fragile facade. Anuradha Bhasin, managing editor of Kashmir Times, called it a "mirage," pointing out that for those born in the 1990s, like lawyer Zuhar, little had changed beyond roads and footpaths. The

Kashmir policy, extended support in fighting terrorism. An all-party meeting, chaired by Singh, saw opposition leaders like Mallikarjun Kharge question Modi's absence but affirm unity against terrorism. Pakistan called the treaty suspension an "act of war," with Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari warning of "rivers of blood" if water flows were halted. The World Bank, a mediator in the treaty, was left uninformed, adding to the diplomatic chaos. Globally, the attack drew condemnation. US President Donald Trump, Russian President Vladimir Putin, and French President Emmanuel Macron expressed solidarity. But at home, the human toll was what lingered. Among the victims was Lt. Vinay Narwal, a 26-year-old Navy officer



ric acid is a chemi cal created when the body breaks down substances called purines. Purines are normally produced in the body and are also found in some foods and drinks. Foods with high content of purines include liver, anchovies, mackerel, dried beans and peas, and beer. Most uric acid dissolves in blood and travels to the kidneys. From there, it passes out in urine. If your body produces too much uric acid or does not remove enough of it, you can get sick. A high level of uric acid in the blood is called hyperuricemia. This test checks to see how much uric acid you have in your blood. Another test that can be used to check the level of uric acid is a test of your urine. Normal values range between 3.5 to 7.2 milligrams per deciliter (mg/dL). Normal value ranges may vary slightly among different laboratories. Talk to your provider about the meaning of your specific test results. The example above shows the common measurement range for results for these tests. Some laboratories use different measurements or


may test different specimens. Certain health conditions, diet, and genetics can cause high levels of uric acid. Avoiding alcohol and limiting some foods and beverages may help lower levels. Uric acid is a natural waste product caused by the digestion of foods containing purines. Purines are found in high levels in some foods and are formed and broken down in your body. Usually, your body filters out uric acid through your kidneys and in urine. If you consume too much purine or if your body is unable to remove this by-product quickly enough, uric acid can build up in your blood. A standard uric acid level is under 6.8 milligrams per deciliter (mg/dL). A high uric acid level (above 6.8 mg/dL) is considered hyperurice-



If a doctor does not find internal hemorrhoids with a digital rectal exam, they may use a small device called an anoscope to check the anal and rectal lining. They may be able to view internal hemorrhoids as bulges through the device.

the deadly terror attack in Pahalgam on April 22 that left 26 civilians dead. The closed-door meeting, which lasted around 40 minutes, came amid a series of intensified security operations across the region, where forces are carrying out raids on the homes of terrorists and their associates.Before meeting the Prime Minister, Singh visited South Block, where he was given a detailed briefing by the Army Chief on the ground situation in Kashmir, particularly in Pahalgam, which has been at the centre of the latest security efforts. The April 22 strike, which killed 25 tourists and one Kashmiri local, has triggered widespread outrage both within India and internationally. Citing "cross-border linkages" to the attack. Indian authorities have vowed a strong and decisive response.On Sunday, in his 121st 'Mann ki Baat' radio address, Prime Minister Modi assured the country that justice would be delivered. "The perpetrators and conspirators of the Pahalgam attack will be served with the harshest response," he said. "The whole world stands with 140 crore Indians in our fight against terrorism. I once again assure the affected families that they will get justice, and justice will be done." In his radio address, PM Modi condemned the Pahalgam terror attack, saying it was a desperate attempt by the enemies of Kashmir and the nation to derail the region's remarkable progress.

The Indian Air Force already operates 36 Rafale fighters, and the acquisition of the naval variants will also enhance the IAF's capabilities, including upgrading the 'buddy-buddy' aerial refuelling system, i.e., which allows one jet, equipped with a refuelling pod, to act as a fuel tanker for another, which allows the fighters to stay airborne longer. The Navy is also planning to induct indigenous, fifth-gen fighter jets that are being developed by the Defence Research and Development Institute, or DRDO. These - styled as twin-engine, deck-based fighters - will be the naval counterpart of the Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft, or AMCA, being developed for the Air Force. The Air Force's 36 Rafale jets - the 'C' variant - operate out of two bases in the north.

Addressing the issue, Hazarika clarified that initial investigations point to a personal financial conflict rather than a politically motivated attack, as alleged by Bordoloi and Congress leaders.azarika emphasized that the attack took place in a region traditionally dominated by the Congress party. "The attempt to link the BJP to this unfortunate event is completely unfounded and highly irresponsible," he stated. He further suggested that internal disputes within the Congress could have been a contributing factor. The minister referenced a recent controversy where a Congress worker had accused Pradyut Bordoloi of demanding money in return for securing a party ticket. Hazarika hinted that such internal grievances might have fueled tensions leading to the assault. Chief Minister Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma has taken the matter seriously and directed authorities to conduct a thorough investigation. Hazarika urged political parties and the public to refrain from politicizing the incident, stressing the importance of ensuring that such unfortunate occurrences are not repeated in the future.In a related development, Assam Police have made significant progress in the investigation by identifying the primary accused in the attack on the convoy of MP Pradyut Bordoloi and Shivamoni Bora. The main accused has been named as Imdadul Islam, a resident of Bhuragaon in Morigaon district. Adding another layer to the controversy, it was revealed that Islam had been expelled from the Congress party just two days before the attack. This revelation strengthens the claims that the motive behind the attack may be linked more to personal and internal

After steps against Pak, Northeast alarm bells was Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, who last week said

authorities have been alerted about the close ties between Pakistan and Bangladesh. Days later on Sunday, Bharatiya Janata Party (MP) Nishikant Dubey called for a similar action on the eastern front. Speaking to reporters, Mr Dubey said: "Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) is in constant touch with Bangladesh's interim government. To stop the terror infiltration, both India and Bangladesh's borders need to be secured. The agreement for the waters of the Ganga was wrong by the then Congress government in 1996." He added: "Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar has been saying it constantly. The West Bengal Chief Minister (Mamata Banerjee) opposed the Teesta Water Agreement. Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma is not in favour of the water of the Brahmaputra going into Bangladesh. How long will we provide water to snakes? It is time to crush the snakes. The entire nation has faith in the PM and the Home Minister. This work will be done soon..."The BJP MP from Godda in Jharkhand was referring to the Ganga Water Treaty that was signed between India and Bangladesh in 1996. His comments also came against the backdrop of India suspending the Indus Waters Treaty that it had signed with Pakistan in 1960, following the terror attack.Just like the Indus Waters Treaty lays down the mechanism for sharing water of the Indus and its tributaries between India and Pakistan, the Ganga Water Treaty is an agreement on the sharing of the waters of the Ganga river between India and Bangladesh. The treaty guarantees 35,000 cusecs of water to Bangladesh if the water flow is around 70,000-75,000 cubic feet per second (cusecs), and divides the water equally if the flow falls below 70,000 cusecs. The treaty, signed in 1996, is scheduled for renewal in 2026, after 30 years. A team from Bangladesh visited West Bengal earlier this year for a field visit to the Farakka Barrage ahead of talks on the issue.India has its own interests when it comes to the waters and often, it is because of these treaties why India was never able to make full use of the potential of the river waters. For India, the Farakka Barrage is critical for the Hooghly River system and West Bengal as it feeds the tributary of the Ganga, the Hooghly River which services the Kolkata and the Haldia ports as well. On Sunday, Mr Sarma said India must act against Bangladesh, the way it did with Pakistan, amid concerns over cross-border infiltration. "I think India should take a tough action against Bangladesh and I am sure these measures are under consideration by the Government of India. But these are strategic decisions, and we should not go beyond a point," he said. "As a Chief Minister, we can request but a decision will be taken by the Government of India after considering the entire security aspect of whether you can take on both Pakistan and Bangladesh at a time or whether you take them on one by one, that is a decision to be taken by the central government. But I also share the same sentiment of other political leaders of the Northeast region who have demanded tough action against Bangladesh," he added. Earlier, the Chief Minister said: "We are also concerned about Bangladesh and the recent hobnobbing between Bangladesh and Pakistan. So, we have alerted our security agencies and asked them to maintain strict vigil and be aware of what is going on across the border." Tipra Motha chief Pradyot Bikram Manikya Debbarman, whose party is an ally of the ruling BJP in Tripura, said: "Bangladesh and Pakistan will try to surround India, one from the western side and one from the eastern side. I completely support the Government of India. A horrific incident has happened in Pahalgam, and the Government of India has reacted."He added: ""The Government of India should also react when the same thing happens in east India because we are as much Indians, proud Indians. The behaviour of Bangladesh towards India and the behaviour of Pakistan should be dealt with in the same way... we want the Government of India to be as strong with Pakistan and Bangladesh." In a post on X, Mr Debbarman flagged the issue of infiltration from Bangladesh to India through the Northeast Indian region. "Illegal Bangladeshis are entering every day! For every five people apprehended, 1,000 get away because of the terrain and porous border. Tripura is going through a demographic change once again! Both Assam and Tripura and parts of Meghalava have become transit points for illegal migration to the Northeast and rest of India. The Indigenous Tribes that are asking for land rights here are doing so because we know sooner than later, we will be overrun by illegal migration. Can we expect justice and attention from the rest of India? Our boys know the area and if given the support, will defend our land and kick out illegal Bangladeshis from entering our country." Recently, Bangladesh recently called for stronger ties with Pakistan and hardline Islamic radicals and terror-accused have been released from prison. These anti-India voices have also allegedly held meetings with members of the Interim Government of Bangladesh, Muhammad Yunus. Former Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's son, Sajeeb Wazed, highlighted one such meeting on X. The post features photographs of Harun Izhar, a hardcore militant and decades-old Harkat-ul-Jihad-al Islami Bangladesh (HuJI-B) operative, meeting Law Adviser Nazrul reportedly in the Law Ministry's offices. Izhar has known links to Lashkar-e-Taiba, which has carried out several attacks on India, including the 26/11 terror attacks in Mumbai.

How can I push for statehood using the Pahalgam terror attack?"Underlining the impact of the ghastly attack on the entire country, he said, "From north to south and from east to west... from Arunachal to Guiarat and Jammu and Kashmir to Kerala... the entire country has been affected by this attack."Abdullah said the Baisaran attack took place after a gap of 21 years. "We thought such attacks were a story of the past. Unfortunately, this (Pahalgam) attack has recreated a situation we hoped had been left behind. We never know when another such attack might take place. I do not have the words to seek forgiveness from the families who lost their dear ones," he said. "We must boost and nurture this spirit of unity. compassion, and resilience that has emerged from among the people themselves," he added.Addressing the Assembly earlier while moving the resolution, Deputy CM Choudhary said, "This House expresses its profound shock and anguish at the barbaric and inhumane attack on innocent civilians in Pahalgam on April 22, 2025."He reiterated the House's unequivocal condemnation of the heinous and cowardly act that resulted in the loss of innocent lives. Ouoting the resolution, Choudhary said, "Such acts of terror are a direct assault on the ethos of Kashmiriyat, the values enshrined in our Constitution, and the spirit of unity, peace, and harmony that have long characterized Jammu and Kashmir and our nation. This House stands in full solidarity with the victims and their families, the document stated. "We extend our deepest condolences to those who have suffered irreparable loss and affirm our collective resolve to share in their grief and support them in their hour of need."It mentioned the supreme sacrifice of pony ride operator Syed Adil Hussain Shah who laid down his life while trying to save the tourists from the terrorist attack. "His courage and selflessness embody the true spirit of Kashmir and shall serve as an enduring inspiration for future generations.""This House commends the people of Kashmir and Jammu for their extraordinary display of unity, compassion, and resilience in the aftermath of the attack."The peaceful demonstrations across towns and villages, and the spontaneous outpouring of moral and material support towards tourists, reaffirm people's steadfast commitment to peace, communal harmony, and the rule of law," the resolution stated. It also mentioned the Assembly's endorsement of diplomatic measures announced by the Centre following a meeting of the Cabinet Committee on Security a day after the tragedy."This House is mindful of the sinister design behind the selective targeting of the victims of this attack. It appeals to all sections of society, and in particular the media, to not fall victim to this sinister plot by irresponsibly inflaming passions. The need to remain united in the face of this attempted division cannot be overemphasised."It appealed to all states and Union territories to ensure the safety, dignity and well-being of Kashmiri students and citizens residing or travelling there, and to take all necessary measures to prevent their harassment, discrimination or intimidation."This House calls upon all political parties, religious and community leaders, youth organizations, civil society groups, and media houses across the nation to maintain calm, reject violence and divisive rhetoric, and work collectively to uphold peace, unity, and constitutional values," the resolution stated.



This latest move to block online platforms reflects India's broader strategy to clamp down on digital propaganda emerging from hostile territories, especially during national crises. Officials have indicated that monitoring of online content will continue aggressively to ensure that malicious

party conflicts rather than any external political rivalry. Authorities continue to investigate the case, with further updates expected as the probe progresses.

China backs Pakistan, calls for 'swift

Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar, state-run Xinhua news agency reported. Mr. Dar briefed Mr. Wang - also a member of the Political Bureau of the Communist Party of China (CPC) Central Committee - on the latest tensions between Pakistan and India "following a terrorist attack in the Kashmir region", it said in the report. For his part, Mr. Wang said China was closely following the developments, stressing that combating terrorism was a shared responsibility of the entire world while reaffirming Beijing's consistent support for Pakistan's firm counterterrorism efforts, it added. "As an ironclad friend and an all-weather strategic cooperative partner. China fully understands Pakistan's legitimate security concerns and supports Pakistan in safeguarding its sovereignty and security interests," the report quoted Mr. Wang as saying."China advocates for a swift and fair investigation and believes that conflict does not serve the fundamental interests of either India or Pakistan, nor does it benefit regional peace and stability," Mr. Wang noted. China hopes both sides will remain restrained, move toward each other, and work together to de-escalate the situation, he added.Mr. Dar emphasised that Pakistan had consistently and firmly fought terrorism and was against any actions that could lead to an escalation of the situation, according to the report. Pakistan is committed to managing the situation in a mature manner and will maintain communication with China and the international community, Mr. Dar said, the news agency reported. On April 23, China "strongly condemned" the brutal terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam in which 26 people, mostly tourists, were killed."We strongly condemn the attack. China firmly opposes all forms of terrorism," Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Guo Jiakun had told a media briefing."We mourn for the lives lost and express sincere sympathies to the bereaved families and the injured," he had said.Separately, China's Ambassador to India Xu Feihong had also condemned the attack."Shocked by the attack in Pahalgam and condemn [it]," he had said in a post on X."Deep condolences for the victims and sincere sympathies to the injured and the bereaved families. Oppose terrorism of all forms," he had said.



Tripura youths rally against border

demonstrators voiced strong opposition to what they claim is the construction of an illegal embankment by Bangladesh, reportedly extending beyond the agreed boundary lines into Indian territory. Massive deployments of security forces, including the Border Security Force (BSF) and Tripura Police, were witnessed at the protest site to prevent any escalation. Suraj Debbarma, President of the Youth Tipra Federation, accused the interim government of Bangladesh, led by Md Yunus, of violating international laws by constructing embankments beyond the 150-yard boundary limit. "As indigenous people of Tripura and citizens of India, it is our fundamental right to safeguard our land and borders. If the Government of India does not act swiftly, we, the indigenous youth under the legacy of Maharaja Pradyot Kishore Manikya, will be compelled to raise this issue ourselves," Debbarma warned. He further issued a stern caution to Bangladesh, stating that if the alleged encroachment continues, the Federation's members would move to "occupy" the Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) and Cox's Bazar, aiming to establish a 'Greater Tipraland' in those areas."We are the sons of this soil and will not tolerate any infringement upon our land," Debbarma asserted, emphasizing their readiness to take stronger action if needed. Tipra Motha Party founder Pradyot Kishore Manikya also weighed in on the situation. Expressing support for the youth protest, he stated, "Thousands of our young warriors gathered today at Belonia. If not for BSF intervention, the illegal construction would have been demolished by now. We are prepared to act decisively; all we require is the green signal."The situation remains tense along the border as indigenous groups continue to demand urgent government intervention.

Additionally, Gogoi raised concerns about alleged coal mafia operations in Assam's hill regions, demanding accountability from the Chief Minister. Tracing the historical roots of the conflict, Sarma noted that tensions began around the time of the Partition of British India. The princely state of Kalat, which covered a major portion of present-day Balochistan, initially sought to remain independent after 1947. However, Pakistan forcibly annexed the region in March 1948, sparking deep and lasting resentment among the Baloch people. According to Sarma, the decades that followed were marked by political marginalization, economic neglect, and cultural suppression. These grievances triggered several major uprisings — in 1958, 1962, 1973, and the early 2000s — each time reaffirming the Baloch people's desire for autonomy. Despite the region's rich reserves of natural resources, Balochistan remains one of Pakistan's most underdeveloped areas. Sarma pointed out allegations of systemic exploitation by the Pakistani central government, which have fueled further anger and unrest among the local population.Reflecting on a significant turning point, Sarma mentioned the assassination of Nawab Akbar Bugti, a prominent Baloch tribal leader, in 2006. He described it as a moment that reignited widespread demands for self-determination and amplified calls for justice. Sarma's remarks come amid growing global focus on indigenous rights and self-rule movements. His comments not only bring attention to the historical injustices faced by the Baloch people but also highlight the broader relevance of indigenous struggles in today's world.

The region's extensive river system not just caters to human life but also helps sustain the rich and diverse ecosystems. From grasslands of Kaziranga National Park to the swamp forests of Dibru-Saikhowa National Park, the Brahmaputra nurtures vibrant habitats home to many endemic and endangered species such as the Gangetic Dolphin and the Golden Mahseer etc. However, the riverine ecosystem faces threats from unchecked infrastructure development in the form of dams, roads and highways along with sand mining, deforestation and both activities relying on pollution. These anthropohistorically predictable wagenic pressures weaken the ter cycles. However, in the river's ability to self-reguface of climate change, erlate leading to shrinking biodiversity. ratic floods have begun to affect crop productivity as standing crops get washed away while dry spells result have led to a reduced fish catch as erratic currents and temperatures disrupt breeding cycles. Additionally, soil erosion is slowly eating away the landmass thus threatening the livelihoods of the people. Recent studies have suggested that

environmental degradation, glacial melt, erratic rainfalls - all of which are taking a toll on our river systems. This requires us to move away from traditional responses like relying on grey infrastructure - think dams and embankments to more ingenious solutions based in nature itself. Deploying Nature based solutions (NbS) like restoring forests and reviving wetlands have proven to be highly effective in building ecological resilience. Restoring forests stabilizes the soil, reducing sediment loads and minimizing the risk of erosion and downstream flooding. Similarly, wetland restoration aids aquifer recharge and improves flood water absorp-

tion. Community led reforestation in Assam has demonstrated encouraging results against the unpredictable forces of nature and offer a great opportunity to build long-term resilience strategies. Conclusion

Today, rivers of the EHR are changing, and changing with them the region's geography, ecology, economy and society. Climate impacts and ecological degradation are the two major drivers of this change. But with a proactive approach, the impacts can be mitigated.
